## **Words and Explanations**

**adversity** (ad VUR suh tee) Adversity is an extremely difficult experience or situation that is hard to overcome.

**bristle** (BRIHS uhl) If you bristle toward someone or something, you act in an angry or irritated way toward it.

enunciate (ih NUHN see ayt) If you enunciate a word, you pronounce it very clearly.

**exclusion** (ehk SKLOO zhuhn) An exclusion is something that has been left out on purpose.

**disposition** (DIHS puh ZIHSH uhn) Your disposition is your personality or mood.

**distinct** (dihs TIHNGKT) If something is distinct, it is clear or obvious. **graphically** (GRAF uh kuhl lee) When people describe something graphically, they use so much detail that you feel like you can see it.

intone (ihn TOHN) If you intone something, you say it slowly and clearly and in a flat, dull voice.

**invariably** (ihn VAIR ee uh blee) When something happens invariably, it always happens when you expect it to.

narcissistic (NAHR sih SIHS tihk) People who are narcissistic think mostly about themselves and admire themselves greatly.
